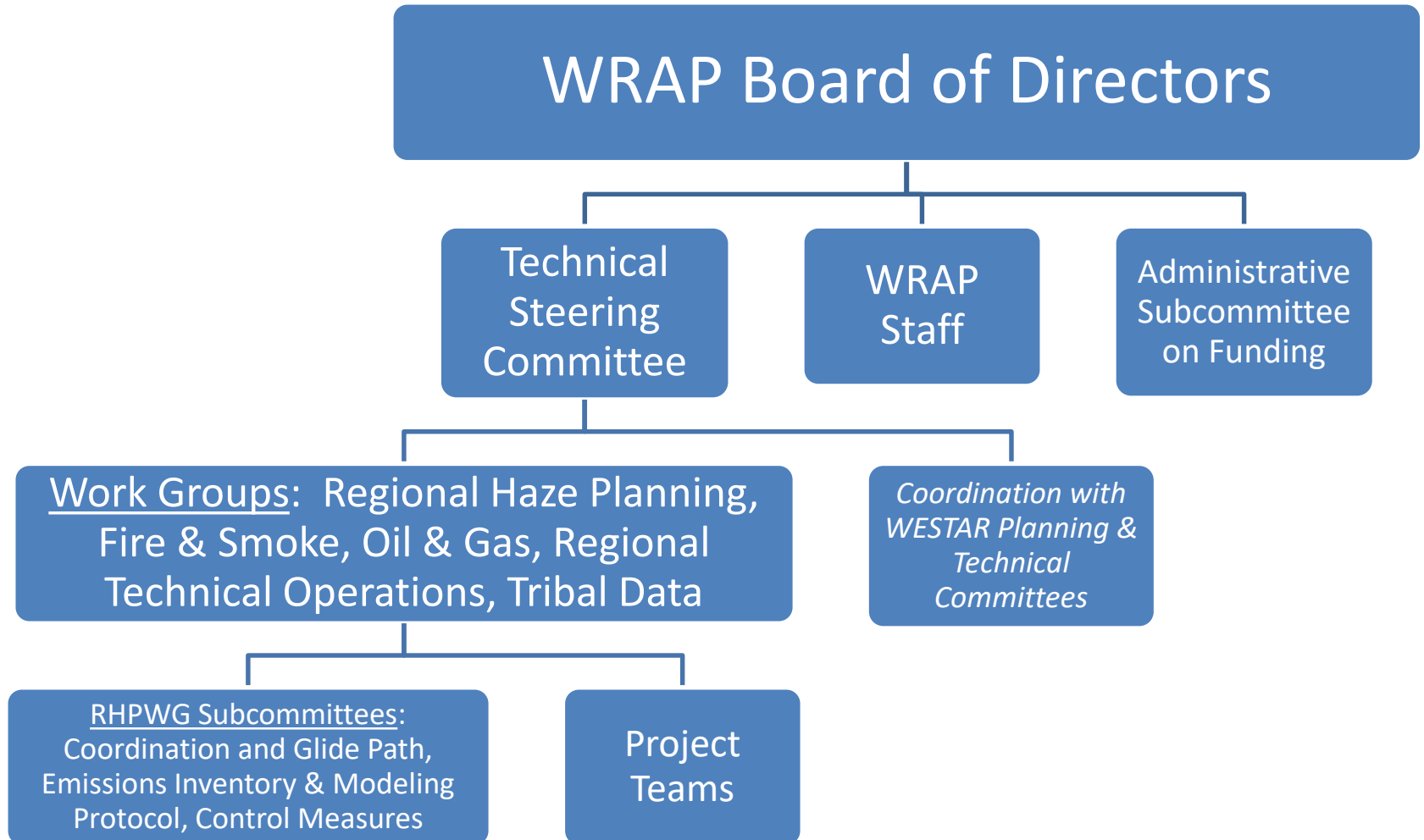
WRAP Regional Haze Principles of Engagement

- Dependent on member contributions, participation, and discussion
- Transparent and trustworthy partnership
