What happens when a NAAQS changes?





Revised NAAQS Promulgated	Governor submits area designation recommendation	EPA notifies states of any intended changes to the recommendation "120-day letter"	EPA publishes notice of state recommendation Start 30-day public comment process	
	Within One Year	120 days before	Not required by	

final designations



<u>Requirements found in Clean Air Act §107(d)</u>

Planning Timeline


State submits any additional information to respond to EPA's modifications

EPA promulgates final area designations

60 days from the "120-day letter"

No later than Two Years from NAAQS promulgation





Due three years after NAAQS promulgation

Required under CAA §110(a)

Demonstrates a state has authority to implement, maintain, & enforce the NAAQS



Infrastructure SIP

Includes the Interstate Transport SIP
